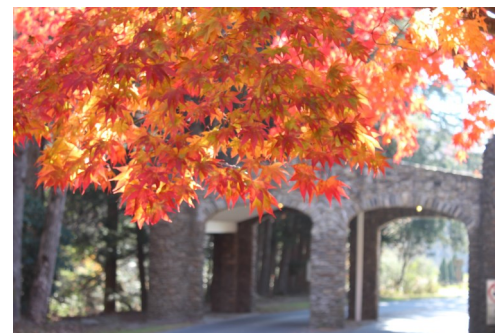

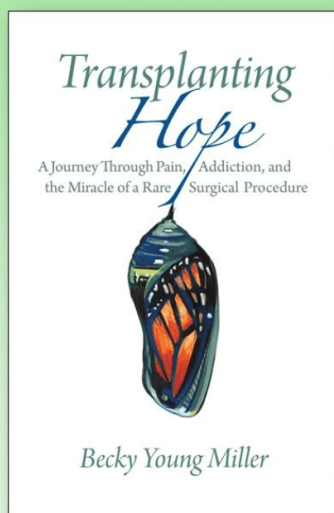

Becky Young Miller is the author of the book "Transplanting Hope," a memoir about her struggles with pain and addiction, as well as the deepening of her faith. Ms. Miller is the wife of a Presbyterian pastor who served at Sea Island Presbyterian Church in Beaufort (and has guest preached at LPC!). This is a wonderful opportunity to invite friends and neighbors to LPC to hear about an ordinary woman's extraordinary journey of faith.

Synopsis of "Transplanting Hope": At age twenty-eight, Becky Miller was a businesswoman and pastor's wife, preparing to be a mother. Narcotics, feeding tubes, and transplant surgery were not on her radar. But when an undiagnosed illness changes the trajectory of her life, Becky becomes an expert in pain. After losing her job, her community, the children she had hoped to adopt, her pancreas, and her perceived control of life -- her teetering faith ultimately discovers new depth and strength. Hope and humor find surprising footing in this memoir, which chronicles her rise from despair to hope.

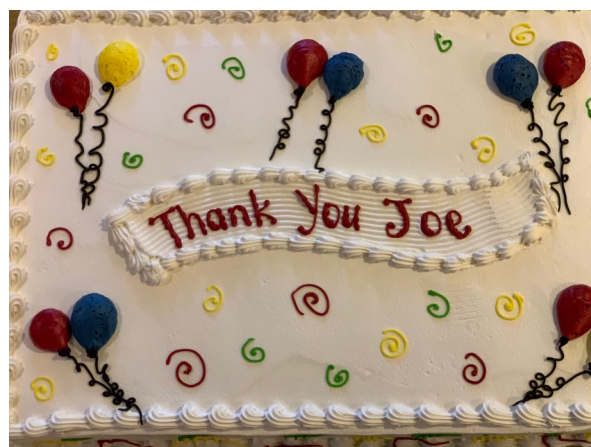

An Update from the Annual Report: LPC's Stephen Ministry completed **441** hours in 2019!

We meet monthly and discuss any problems that may arise with our Care Receivers and offer support and encouragement to one another. We also do continuing education time as a group. In September 2019, we had an outside speaker from Hospice of the Lowcountry speak to us, as well as Stephen Ministers invited from Lord of Life Lutheran, Church of the Palms, Bluffton Methodist, and Church of the Cross. Hello, I am **Sarah Bleile** and I was raised in this church. I am currently serving as a Young Adult Volunteer in New Orleans. The YAV program is run through the Presbyterian Church (USA.) This year so far hasn't been easy, but I am enjoying my time and learning so much.

I work for the YMCA of Greater New Orleans for their program called YMCA Educational Services (YES). YES! offers adult education classes that will help students improve their reading, writing and math skills. I help out in the classroom by working with the students and answering questions. It feels good when you see the students get that "ah ha" moment when it

finally clicks in their brain. I also do community education, where I give assistance to patrons who need help with anything to do with the computer. Most recently as a staff we have had to adjust and figure out our roles again due to staffing changes. I now help assist with keeping up with and inputting data.

It's not easy living in a house with four other people. When house conflict comes up, it's not necessarily the easiest thing to address. I have had to learn not to keep my feelings bottled up inside me and to express them honestly. As a house, we have learned that it takes time to solve conflict. Navigating life with a roommate was a challenge for me going into the year. As it has turned out, my roommate and I are best friends, and the only females in the house.

The time that I spend with my community, is the time that I value most. As a community, we get together on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays for a meal and a meeting. In November, one of our housemates left the program and we had to adjust as a house and figure out how to be a community of five and not six. I believe that this change brought us closer as a community, making our bond as a house of five stronger because we had all created a relationship with this housemate who is now no longer there.

A part of this year, we are tasked to find a church that we would like to get involved in to grow our faith. Each week, I attend Lakeview Presbyterian Church. I have found my new LPC. I get to share going to church with one of my housemates. One thing that we got to do together was light the joy candle during Advent. I got to experience my first Presbytery meeting in October. This gave me a look into how the church is run and I am looking forward to the other meetings coming up to learn more about the governing of the church.

Each week I hear from my parents about everyone asking how I am doing and what I am up to. I want to thank you for the continued support throughout the year. It means the world to me.

Session Highlights - January 20, 2020

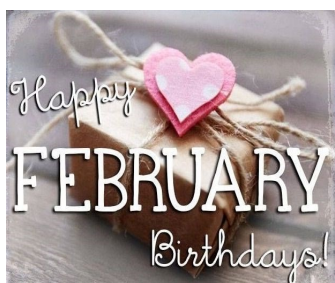
- † At its January 20th Stated Meeting the Session accepted the Membership Ministry Team's recommendation to remove from the LPC roll of active members those who were still on the roll but have either moved away or become inactive (i.e. those who have not been attending services, financially supporting the church or otherwise participating in the life of the church within the last two years). As a result, 31 names were removed from the roll of active members. LPC's membership is now 397 active members and 22 affiliates.
- † The Session re-assigned responsibility for church staff personnel policy development, performance review, compensation, staff support and related matters from the Administration and Finance Ministry Team to a new Personnel Ministry Team. The new team will be led by the chair of Administration and Finance and will include the chairs of Worship and Christian Education. The senior pastor will be an ex-officio member.
- † Elders began discussion of A Long Obedience in the Same Direction by Eugene Peterson, a book they will digest this year.
- † Elder Ernest Bush was re-elected as Clerk of Session.
- † The next Stated Session meeting will be at 7:00 PM on Monday, February 17, 2020.
