During March, the music ministry will be presenting special music for the season of Lent. The Chancel Choir has begun rehearsing the Lenten Cantata, "Hope in the Shadows" arranged by Joel Raney and Lloyd Larson. Performance of the Cantata will be **Sunday, March 29**, at both services. Dress rehearsal will take place on March 28 at 10:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary. The Ringers will be playing on March 8th for both services and again on Palm Sunday.



KIRKIN' O'THE TARTAN

On February 9th we conducted our very first Kirkin' o' the Tartan service; and for a day, everyone was "Scottish"! There were lots of tartan plaid in evidence in the congregation, and even a few kilts!

Rev. Herrin's message, "Being Salt and Light" referenced John Knox, founder of the Church of Scotland; the Prayer of Confession was attributed to Rev. Peter Marshall (who initiated the Kirkin' service at New York Avenue

Presbyterian Church in Washington, DC in 1941); and the Scots Confession of 1560 was used as the Affirmation of Faith.

The processional featured the beadle, clan tartan banners and the choir entering the Sanctuary while Rick Kuhn, on bagpipes, and Karen Ball, on the organ, played Highland Cathedral. Rick and Karen's playing of Amazing Grace as the Offertory moved several members of the congregation to tears. At the end of the service the banners assembled at the front of the Sanctuary for Rev. Herrin's blessing and then recessed to Scotland the Brave.

Following the service, the congregation enjoyed a variety of delicious Scottish themed treats and tea, all provided by the willing hands of a number of volunteers. (Who knew haggis would make such a good finger food?)

All in all, the Kirkin' service was inspirational, uplifting, meaningful and actually fun. If you missed it, don't worry ... it will most likely be offered again next year.




Becky Young Miller:

MEN OF PURPOSE (MOP) on Saturday mornings



CHANGE CAN MAKE A CHANGE for the month of March will go to *Backpack Buddies*. Backpack Buddies was originally created by Feeding America and has been instituted across the nation with organizations like Crossroads Community Support Services locally. The premise is simple—children who receive free or subsidized breakfast and lunch plans at school may go hungry over the weekend. Backpack Buddies was developed to help these food-insecure children by sending them home on Friday with a bag of food.

Crossroads purchases the food from Sysco Distributors once a month. Volunteers pick up the food, which has been delivered to our partner at St. Andrews by the Sea United Methodist Church, and then pack it into individual bags. The bags are transported to the school in large bins and then stored on shelves in a closet that has been allocated to us at the school. Each bag contains 2 entrees (mac & cheese and spaghetti & meatballs), 2 packages of Cherrios, 2 packets of oatmeal cereal, 2 granola bars, 2 pudding cups and 1 fruit (applesauce or raisins). Before the bags are distributed to the children on Fridays a fresh fruit is added.

Lowcountry Presbyterian Church alternates monthly with Oldfield to pack and distribute the food to the children at Prichardville Elementary School. We currently have 55 children enrolled in the program there. By supporting Backpack Buddies, you will not only be feeding the children at Prichardville, but also children at Bluffton's three other elementary schools and two high schools. Sue and Ken Kroupa who founded the program are hoping to be able to expand the program, to reach more children in need. Your support will greatly help them to do that.

Session Highlights - February 17, 2020

- † At its February 17th Stated Meeting the Session accepted the Membership Ministry Team's recommendation, based on its continuing review of the church's rolls, to remove from the LPC roll of active members those who were still on the roll but have become inactive. As a result, 7 additional names were removed from the roll of active members. LPC's membership is now 384 active members and 22 affiliates.
- † Elder Burns was elected as our commissioner to the February 22nd Charleston Atlantic Presbytery's winter meeting to be held in our Sanctuary. Elder Kimble was elected commissioner for the CAP meeting to be held at First Presbyterian Church, Orangeburg (September 19th). Elder Thorpe was elected commissioner for the CAP meeting to be held at Yeamans Presbyterian Church, Hanahan (December 8th).
- † The Session approved use of the Fellowship Hall as lodging for the Lisbon, Ohio youth service group Leading Youth Following Truth for the period July 18th through July 25th. Also approved was the use of the Fellowship Hall to continue to host Family Promise, June 14th through June 28th and September 13th through September 27th. Finally, the Session approved the use of the Fellowship Hall in response to Family Promise's request to provide lodging only for the periods April 12th through April 19th and for December 27th through January 3rd, 2021.
- † Fulfilling a stated requirement of the Charleston Atlantic Presbytery, the Session adopted the Administration and Finance Committee's draft of a comprehensive Manual of Administrative Operations, including the also specifically required Sexual Misconduct Policy.
- † Finally, the Session unanimously adopted the following resolution:

The Session hereby affirms its continuing and strong support for Rev. Christine Herrin and her ministry at Lowcountry Presbyterian Church. The Session commits to continuing to pray for her and her success and urges the congregation to do the same.

The next Stated Session meeting will be at 7:00 PM on Monday, March 16, 2020.
