






# Drive-Thru THANKSGIVING FOOD COLLECTION AT LPC Sunday, November 15th - 11:30 am - 1:00 pm


Please pray for these families and pray we can once again have a tree next year. Thank you for your amazing generosity over the many years of our **Angel Tree**.


# **Wednesday Zoom Classes**

On Wednesdays, November 4, 11, 18 and 25, at 4:00pm via Zoom. The study on the Sermon on the Mount, is based on a study by Dr. Amy-Jill Levine. We will watch a video together and have discussion. This class is co-led by Chris & Stephanie.

Dr. Amy-Jill Levine is a University Professor of the New Testament and Jewish Studies and Mary Jane Werthan Professor of Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School and College of Arts and Sciences.







# **Advent Study**

There will be an Advent study on Wednesdays in December at 4:00pm via Zoom. The study is entitled *The Messiah: An Adult Advent Study*. Written by world-renowned Old Testament scholar Walter Brueggemann, this four session adult study takes a critical look at the four royal titles used in Isaiah 9:2-7: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Adults will be challenged to learn how the people understood those titles during Jesus' time and discuss how Jesus did or did not fulfill the titles. They will also reflect on how Christians interpret Jesus as representing that title.

Advent devotionals will be available in the Narthex at the end of November.

#### **CONFIRMATION CLASS 2020**

Confirmation is a process of youth discerning if they are ready to make a profession of faith of Jesus as Lord and Savior and join the church.

Pastor Stephanie has been meeting 9th graders Ella Barry and Mark Stauffer for a Confirmation class on Saturday mornings! They are learning about the Bible, theological concepts like grace, sin, and reconciliation, reading through the gospel of Mark together, journaling, and learning prayer practices.



We hope you will pray for them as they continue through the class and discern if they are ready to be confirmed and join the church by profession of faith!



### Elders elected by unanimous vote!

Congratulations LPC Family, for navigating our first ever electronic vote for elders. Financial results as of the end of the third quarter show the net surplus/(deficit) of (\$16,550) which is \$23,167 better than the budgeted deficit of (\$39,717). September was the first month where giving (membership and loose offerings) fell below what was anticipated in the budget. Disbursements continue to be less than budgeted. The Session continues to monitor the financial performance closely, and is encouraged by the continued generosity of the membership.

We were blessed with clear skies and warm weather and were greeted by Gretchen and Jon Nickel who had arrived early and staked out a place in the sand while Jon quietly played guitar.

We began with donuts and coffee (picked up at 5:45 at Dunkin' Donuts by Robin and Karen) and the signing of sea shells (provided by Gretchen and Jon) while watching the sun rise and taking lots of incredible pictures. This was followed by singing (in masks and socially distanced) led by Dale Nordby and Bob Lowry, an opening prayer by Maureen Kalmbach and scripture reading by Reta Kemper.



#### Session Highlights - October, 2020

At its October Stated Meeting, conducted via Zoom video conferencing, the Session:

Noted that LPC's membership is now 367 active members and 21 affiliate members.

Heard a report from Elder Thorpe, chairman of the Elder Nominating Committee on the work of the committee over the past few months. Elder Thorpe thanked the committee members for their hard work. He noted that at the October 25th called congregational meeting, the committee will nominate Larry Tremitiere and Diane Mikkelson to serve as elders for the class of 2023 and Donald Allison to fill an unexpired term for the class of 2021.

Elder Thorpe also reported that though they will not be members of the Session, Maureen Kalmbach and Wim Tekelenburg have agreed to provide additional leadership to the Membership Ministry Team and to the Building and Grounds Ministry Team, respectively.

Approved a request from the Membership Ministry Team to host a brunch immediately following the 10:30 AM worship service on Sunday, November 8th. The brunch will be held outside on the church grounds with appropriate physical distancing observed.

Extended an invitation to Bo Welch to be our guest preacher for Sunday, November 15th.

Received a draft of the 2021 budget from the Administration and Finance Ministry Team. Elder Adamson noted that the financial condition of the church warrants significant Session attention and, in that connection, called for the Session to meet for in-depth discussion on strategies to drive membership growth.

Heard an expanded report from Elder Bogle on the Christian Education Ministry. She reviewed the challenges to meeting the goals of Christian education posed by volunteer turnover and, most especially the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Though there was good news in that a number of members have taken advantage of the virtual learning opportunities offered by Christian Education, she would like to see more members volunteer to lead classes and to participate in those classes. She noted that CE is now offering a six-week program on the Sermon on the Mount and is planning a program series focused on Advent.

Based on observations from the October 18th worship service, adopted a motion to increase the maximum number of worshipers allowed to attend the 10:30am worship service from 70 to 80, to open the balcony to handle any overflow from the Sanctuary and to use the number of worshipers seated in the balcony to trigger Session evaluation of the resumption of the 8:30am worship service.
