# How to Help Victims of Hurricane Laura Change Can Make A Change for September

Change Can Make A Change – CCMAC for September is

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), "Out of Chaos, HOPE!"

PDA enables congregations and mission partners of the Presbyterian Church (USA) to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crises and catastrophic events. The need for funds is ongoing and is much appreciated especially at this time of need to respond to Hurricane Laura. They are currently responding to:

**lowa Derecho** (*USA*) – On August 10, severe thunderstorms with damaging winds (derecho) devastated lowa, causing widespread power outages for more than 150,000 people for several days. As many as 14 million acres of farmland were also damaged by the storm. PDA is working with Presbyteries in these areas to respond to this storm.

**Beirut Explosion** (*Lebanon*) - Relief efforts are under way in Beirut to help more than 300,000 people displaced by the August 4 port explosion. PDA is supporting the humanitarian assistance in the aftermath of the explosion by providing grants that are used for emergency humanitarian needs, which can include anything from medical supplies, personal protective equipment, water and more.

**Easter Tornadoes** (*USA*) – During the weekend of Easter 2020, several southeastern states experienced severe storms and tornadoes. Throughout the two-day outbreak, total of 140 tornadoes touched down across 10 states, inflicting widespread and locally catastrophic damage. PSA has virtually deployed National Response Team Members to support the response while also granting funds.

**Yemen** (*Yemen*) – These people are facing the biggest humanitarian crisis in the world with 14 million at risk of starvation and death due to repeated outbreaks of diseases like cholera. Since 2018, PDA has been responding in partnership with Generations Without Qat, Presbyterian Hunger Program and PCUSA to support WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) projects, emergency and transitional shelter and humanitarian response to famine as well as grants for COVID-19 response.

**COVID-19** (*Worldwide*) – In company with the whole church, PDA began their response in February with a solidarity grant to our ACT Alliance partner in China. As the virus began to spread, PDA prepared and offered guidance to PCUSA congregations for safe practices. PDA pulled 2.7 million dollars from reserves to seed the ongoing response both in the US and internationally. In addition to making these grant funds available, PDA has ramped up our Emotional and Spiritual Care programs, including Compassion Fatigue and Resiliency workshops, and they are broadly available.

Other areas of current response include Tennessee Tornadoes, Puerto Rico, Hurricane Dorian and Spring Tornadoes and Flooding. Now that we are in hurricane season, more disaster may be in store. We pray that God will keep everyone safe.



PDA was selected because, due to the pandemic, we did not collect for the usual "One Great Hour of Sharing" which supports this work. If you would like to help PDA with their efforts both in the US and worldwide, please make a check payable to LPC and indicate "CCMAC-PDA" in the memo section. The need for funds in ongoing and is much appreciated!

Food donations are still being collected for those in need in our communities. Actual food items may be dropped off at **Bluffton Self Help** on Mondays from 10 am to 2 pm or monetary donations can be made on their website at **blufftonselfhelp.org**.



Food products for **Agape Family Life Center** may be dropped off outside the church on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9 am to noon. They are in great need of toilet paper (individually wrapped rolls are easier to distribute) and baby food. Fresh fruits (except bananas because they ripen too soon) are especially appreciated. #### GED Student Returns

We had a student in last year's GED course, Kathy P, who did not complete the course. She moved to Mexico with her boyfriend who is the father of her two toddlers. Unfortunately, things there did not work out and she has returned with her children, to be near family. Kathy is 22 and lives in Okatie. Her parents and sister all work and are unable to babysit during the day. Kathy now works the night shift at Circle K six or seven nights a week and wants to get her GED.

She already passed science, so she needs to pass language arts, math reasoning, and social



studies to earn her GED. Michele Eberhart (language arts) and Jerri Hanna (math) are on board to tutor via Zoom, and Kathy may also need tutoring for social studies. She will take practice tests this week to determine her best subject, and we will begin with that.

# 10 TIPS ON IMPROVING COMMUNICATION SKILLS

Learning effective communication skills, knowing how to listen well and communicate clearly, is a straightforward process that allows you to express yourself and potentially improve your relationships.

#### Develop your listening skills

The best communicators are almost always the best listeners. Listen without judgment and don't be distracted by thinking about what you want to say next. Then, respond, not react. Fight the urge to respond immediately and listen to what the person is trying to communicate.

#### Pay attention to non-verbal communication

This includes facial expressions, eye contact, body postures and gestures, tone of voice and the space between the speaker and listener. Make eye contact with your listener/speaker to show that he/she has your full attention; Nod your head frequently encouraging the person to go on.

#### Choose the right words

Choose words that will symbolize what you mean. Make sure you select words that will enable the listener to understand what you really mean. Using jargon may seem like a good idea, but the point of communication – "the understanding" – may be lost.

#### Use the reflecting process

Don't assume things because that can result in misunderstandings. Paraphrase and restate key words or the last few words spoken. Be aware not to over-mirror as this can become irritating and a distraction.

#### Have the right attitude

Develop an attitude of dignity and respect for others and yourself. Be willing to understand people and respect their opinions.

#### Simplify and stay on message

Use simple, straightforward language. Remember that Lincoln's Gettysburg Address was 286 words, about two minutes long.

#### Respect your audience

Recognize your message is not just about you or what you want. You should sincerely care about the needs and the unique perspectives of those to whom you are communicating. One of the best ways to show your respect is simply by paying attention to what they say.

#### Maintain eye contact

Maintaining eye contact builds credibility and demonstrates you care about your listeners.

#### Show empathy

Being able to understand the feelings of those around you is an integral part of being an effective communicator. Empathizing means both understanding and relating to someone else's feelings.

#### Ask for feedback

There's no shame in asking for honest feedback on your communication skills from colleagues, friends, or acquaintances. Asking for their advice on improving your communication skills can help you better understand how you are coming across to others.





#### Session Highlights - August, 2020

At its August Stated Meeting, conducted via Zoom video conferencing, the Session:

- † Noted that LPC currently has 368 members and 21 affiliate members.
- † Participated in the Charleston Atlantic Presbytery's Committee on Ministry Triennial Visit. The Visit was conducted via Zoom video conference and included Rev. Becky Albright, Associate Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church Beaufort and Richard Norris, Lay Pastor of the Sea Island Presbyterian Church. Dialogue included local ministries, planning, officer training, challenges being faced and interaction with the Presbytery.
- † Elected Elder Thorpe to serve as LPC's Commissioner to the September 19th Presbytery Meeting. This meeting would have been held at the First Presbyterian Church, Orangeburg, but given the pandemic will be conducted on-line.
- † Discussed the need to develop new initiatives to increase the congregation's connection with the church and each other during this time of social isolation. Each ministry team was encouraged to developing and implementing at least one such initiative and to report on their progress at the September Session Meeting.
- † Reviewed the first limited -attendance- worship- service video recording on Friday, August 7th for streaming on Sunday, August 9th. Seven family units (eleven individuals) attended, all following the established COVID-19 protocols. Participants reported feeling "safe" while a few expressed some frustration at not being able to sing out loud. All found it good to be back worshipping in the sanctuary.

The next Stated Session meeting will be at 7:00 PM on Monday, September 21, 2020.
